Coverage

There is a lot of concern around the drop in coverage. The lowest uptake is in the 25-34 year olds. This means that there will be a rise in the number of cancers in this cohort. The evidence from countries which introduced the HPV vaccine earlier than England, shows a dramatic reduction in the number of cervical cancers. However, this won't help those who are 25 and older now, as they were not vaccinated.

A concerted effort is needed to encourage women to attend for cervical screening.

A Demos report clearly highlighted the urgent need to find ways to encourage more women to attend screening.

"If we make the necessary small investment now we could not only save millions of pounds for the state in both the short and long term but also save many more women from losing their fertility, bladder and bowel function, prevent the onset of early menopause, stop the significant reduction in their quality of life, and ultimately save lives".
